



## Miami Herald Joins FOIA Lawsuit on Saudi Ties to 9/11

The Miami Herald, one of the nation's most influential newspapers, has announced that it is joining the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) lawsuit which is seeking tens of thousands of pages of FBI files relevant to its investigation of the Saudi support network for the 9/11 hijackers that was operating in the Sarasota, Florida area. The suit was originally filed by the Broward Bulldog, and was recently joined by the Herald-Tribune Media Group, which publishes the Sarasota Herald-Tribune and a number of other Florida papers.

After originally claiming that it had found no links between the 9/11 attacks and a wealthy Saudi family which fled from Sarasota shortly before the Sept. 2001 terror attacks, the FBI recently disclosed that it has more than 15,000 documents (each of which likely contains multiple pages) concerning the FBI Tampa Field Office's investigation of 9/11.

The suit seeking the FBI documents, parallels the growing momentum for the release of the suppressed 28 pages in the Congressional Joint Inquiry report, concerning Saudi support for the 9/11 hijackers.
