USA Keeps Fighting for Iran

According to neoconservative theoreticians <u>David Wurmser and Richard</u> <u>Perle</u>, George W. Bush's Iraq War II (supported by Senator Biden) was supposed to <u>weaken Iran and Syria</u> and therefore Hezbollah's threat to Israel. Obama's dirty war in Syria (Supported by Vice-President Biden) was supposed to weaken Iran by taking out their friend Bashar al-Assad, the "keystone" of the arch of Iranian power in the region. Instead Assad asked Iran, Hezbollah and Russia to come help and is now more dependent on them than ever before, especially after Western, Turkish, GCC and Israeli support for the bin Ladenites blew up into the <u>ISIS Caliphate</u> which required Obama to launch Iraq War III (2014–2018), <u>back on the side of the Iraqi Shi'ites</u> they wish they hadn't fought Iraq War II for.
